




## THE YOUNG ADULT MINISTRY:



## THE SUNDAY SCHOOL'S SAINT OF THE MONTH:

### Synaxis of the Holy Glorious Prophet, Forerunner and Baptist John


On the day following the Theophany of the Lord, the Church honours the one who participated directly in the Baptism of Christ, placing his own hand upon the head of the Savior.

Saint John, the holy Forerunner and Baptist of the Lord, whom the Lord called the greatest of the prophets, concludes the history of the Old Testament and opens the era of the New Testament. The holy Prophet John bore witness to the Only-Begotten Son of God, incarnate in the flesh. Saint John was accounted worthy to baptize Him in the waters of the Jordan, and he was a witness of the Theophany of the Most Holy Trinity on the day of the Savior's Baptism. Saint John prepared himself in the wilds of the desert for his great service by a strict life, by fasting, prayer and sympathy for the fate of God's people.

Saint John died a martyr's death, beheaded by the sword on orders of King Herod at the request of his daughter Salome.




## THE HOME SCHOOL MINISTRY:

## THE CHARITY SPOTLIGHT:

### Blessings for All By Michelle Alexopoulos

It is truly amazing what a difference a community can make when it is united together with a mission to help others. In November, we called out to our parish community to help give "Bags of Blessings" to adults and children in need. Many from St. George came forward to support this effort and, in the end, volunteers, old and young, together in multiple shifts, wearing masks (and smiling beneath them – see picture), met to fill these bags in our Church basement. It was a blessing for all of us. The fruits of the labour resulted in 150 bags for men, 75 bags for women and 80 bags for the children (See picture). All of the Blessing Bags were picked up by St. John the Compassionate Mission and were distributed in time for the Nativity Feast to those in need who have been using their services. The need this year has been greater than usual at the Mission, and we were told that when volunteers at the Mission discovered the bags would be coming again this year, it was a bit of happy news that they were delighted to be able to share. Each package contained essential toiletries, such as toothpaste, toothbrushes, shampoo and conditioner, soap, deodorant, combs, shaving cream and razors (for adults only), as well as socks, hats, and gloves to help keep the recipients warm during the winter months. Candies, pens, Kleenex, sewing kits, and lip balm also were lovingly bundled by our parishioners to be included along with corporate donations of packages of dried fruit and Ferrero Rocher chocolates for the adults and KinderSantas for the children. With generous support, we were also able to help with the new challenges created by Covid 19, through the inclusion of a facemask and a bottle of hand sanitizer, and blessed to be able to include a Christmas craft and a toy (a Barbie, Basketball, toy cars or puzzles) for each child. We are proud to report that our community was able to help spread some Christmas cheer — something needed even more during these trying times.
